HOW TO USE THIS CHART

Locate the spill you are attempting to clean from the alphabetical list below. Use the solution recommended in the first column first. When the spill no longer responds to this mixture, move to the mixture listed in the second column. When the spill no longer responds to the second mixture, move to the mixture listed in column Three; and so forth. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to call our office for advice.

- A** One tablespoon household ammonia added to one cup of water
- C** Dry Cleaning Solvent. Do NOT put directly on carpet. Put small amounts on towel only and gently blot the spill
- D** Half a teaspoon of mild, powdered, non-bleaching laundry detergent mix in a pint of luke-warm water
- H** Dry vacuum only
- P** Call the professionals at the butler Carpet Cleaners
- V** One part white vinegar mixed in two parts water
